


Quick Tips for Graduate and

Parking Permits and Zones



- The WashU campus is divided into 5 parking zones, with red permits allowing for weekday parking in any zone and yellow permits allowing only for parking within a specific zone.
- Parking in yellow spaces across all zones is free from 5pm-7am on weekdays and any time on weekends.




Which Parking Options Am I Eligible For?



WashU grad students who live off campus may choose to apply for the following permits (2017-18 pricing information is available [here](#)):

- A standard yellow permit for Zone 2 or Zone 3, which is valid weekdays, evenings, and weekends
- An evening yellow permit, which is valid for Zones 2, 3, and 5 between 3:30pm and 7:00am
- A ParkSmart permit for Zone 5 (West Campus) that allows for an easy shuttle or MetroLink commute to the Danforth campus
- Enrollment in WashU's Occasional Parking Program, which allows for a fixed allotment of daily passes that are valid in one of the yellow zones



Where Can I Pick Up My Permit?



I participated in the parking lottery for 2017-18:

Grad students who participated in the parking lottery for 2017-18 can pick up their permit at the Gargoyle (lower level of [Mallinckrodt Center](#)) from 10am-3:30pm, August 28-30. Alternatively, students can pick up their permit at the Parking and Transportation office ([North Campus](#)) after June 29.



I did not participate in the parking lottery for 2017-18:

Grad students who did not participate in the parking lottery but who still wish to purchase a permit should contact Parking and Transportation Services (parktrans@wustl.edu or 314-935-5601) after June 19 to learn which permits/zones are still available.

I applied for a permit but did not receive one:

Parking is a limited resource on the WashU campus. Every effort is made to accommodate students who wish to purchase parking, with permits distributed on a first-come, first-served basis. If your preferred permit is unavailable, contact Parking and Transportation Services (parktrans@wustl.edu or 314-935-5601) to find out which parking options are still available and which have open waitlists.

Alternative Commute Options



WashU supports and encourages grad student efforts to commute sustainably. Several options are available for grad students to choose from if they do not purchase a parking permit.

- All full-time, registered grad students are eligible for a free Metro Transit U-Pass, which allows for travel by bus or train throughout St. Louis and the greater region, with two train stations conveniently located at the northwest and northeast corners of campus. Alternative Commute Options



- Additionally, WashU provides ample bicycle parking and several tune-up stations across campus for students who commute by bike.
- An alternative commute can be paired with enrollment in the Occasional Parking Program, availability permitting, to allow for flexibility on days with inclement weather.
