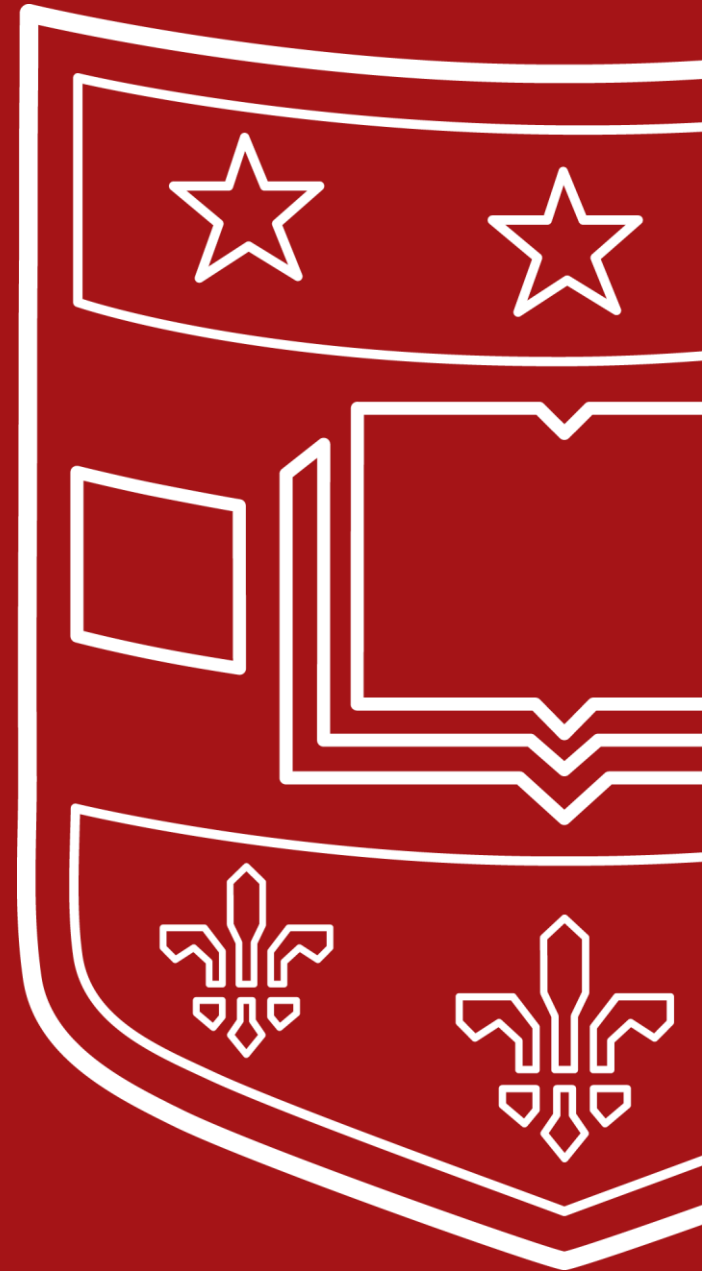


Prevalence of Sexual Harassment and sexual and relationship violence at Wash U and available support



The Prevalence—National Statistics



- 20% of women on campus will experience sexual assault during their college career.
 - ***Over 90% of these victims will know their perpetrator***
- 6.1% of men are sexually assaulted during their college career.
- The rate of sexual assault is highest among people between the ages of 16 and 24.
- The rate of dating violence among this age group is 60%.
- 13% of college women are victims of at least one stalking event during their college career.

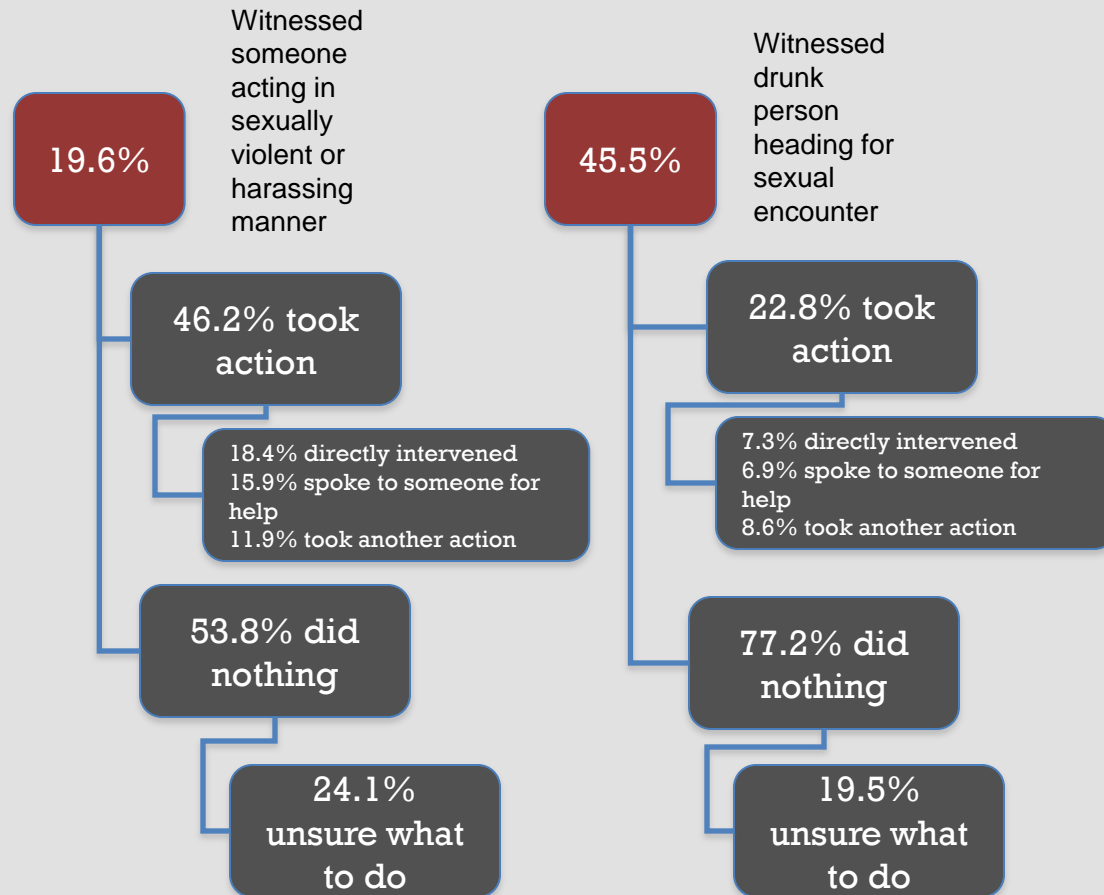
